After a rigorous 12 months, our second cohort of APRN Fellows completed the Fellowship year on June 30. The Fellows served a total of **8,892** patients

"I am appreciative for my time during the AdvancingPractice spanning over 13 Erie sites. More than **50** preceptors supported and mentored the Fellows during our three clinic rotations throughout the year. All Fellows participated in a Quality Improvement Project, ranging from improving breastfeeding rates to campaigning for Erie employees to get their flu shot. Additionally, the entire organization, including the Fellows, went through an EMR transition in early spring, which naturally brought on obstacles in routine processes. COVID-19 challenges, case studies, Spanish classes... to say that our Fellows had a lot on their plate this year is an understatement. Yet, they handled every task thrown at them with grace.

We have seen tremendous growth, professionally and personally, with each Fellow and are so proud of their accomplishments this year. We are pleased to announce that all nine Fellows have accepted positions within organizations that serve Chicago's most vulnerable communities, including five who accepted full time positions at Erie Family Health Centers.
