

Resources for Unaccompanied Minors and Unhoused Youth

Unaccompanied Minors

Illinois state law allows unaccompanied minors to access medical care without parental consent when the minor has documentation from one of the following sources:

- An adult relative
- A representative of a homeless service agency
- An attorney licensed in Illinois
- A public school homeless liaison or social worker
- A social service agency providing services to at risk, homeless, or runaway youth
- A representative of a religious organization

Unaccompanied minors may also access other public benefits such as SNAP and TANF. If the young person is married, pregnant, or a parent they do not need consent from a parent or guardian for medical care and they can apply for public benefits independently.

Erie has an established medical legal partnership with Loyola University Chicago School of Law called the Health Justice Project. Through this partnership, youth can access free legal support services and information on becoming unaccompanied and how to access benefits. Your Erie healthcare providers can place referrals to the Health Justice Project to support you and your legal needs.

Reproductive Services

Minors can access certain reproductive health services without parental consent, such as: pregnancy testing, testing for sexually transmitted infections including HIV, birth control, and emergency contraception (Plan B).

Consent is required for the HPV vaccine.

Minors seeking abortion are required by Illinois law to notify a parent or guardian 48 hours prior to the procedure, consent is not needed. Notification may be waived by judicial bypass if the minor is not able to notify a parent or guardian. Learn more about judicial bypass here: bit.ly/jbypass

Mental Health Services



For minors ages 12-16, no consent is needed from a parent or guardian for eight 90-minute counseling sessions. For minors ages 17 and older no consent is required. For inpatient mental health, minors can voluntarily admit themselves without parental consent at age 16 but a parent or guardian is notified immediately after admission.

For substance use treatment, minors ages 12 and up can access services inpatient or outpatient without parent or guardian consent.

In cases of sexual violence or assault, no consent from a parent or guardian is needed for:

- Making a police report
- Consenting to healthcare at the hospital, including treatment for STIs, HIV, and emergency contraception
- Consenting to evidence collection and release
- 90-days of follow up medical care
- 5 counseling sessions at a rape crisis center (ages 12-16)
