



Oral Health

Erie offers state-of-the-art dental care to children, adolescents, and young adults (ages 0-20), pregnant women, and medical patients who qualify for our oral health program. Services provided include routine cleanings, X-rays, sealants, fillings, crowns, root canals and extractions.

- Erie focuses not only on treating but also on preventing oral health problems. Oral care is integrated into the primary medical care offered at all Erie locations. Erie's medical providers educate patients on the importance of oral health for their overall wellness as part of routine medical visits.
- Erie's Oral Health Education program shows community members how to take care of their oral health at home and how to receive care at Erie dental health centers or other community resources. During FY2015, Erie's designated oral health educator provided community presentations to approximately 3,000 community members.
- In Calendar Year 2017, Erie's Dental Centers treated nearly 12,500 dental patients through over 28,000 dental visits. Erie plans to double its dental care capacity within the next five years.
