Though challenging, the COVID-19 pandemic did not stop us from starting the Fellowship on June 27, 2020 with eight Fellows (pictured above). The Fellows went through a very robust, six-week virtual orientation. Needless to say, they were anxious to get into clinic to start seeing patients. The orientation, however, was a major success and we hope it will serve as an example for other Erie Residency Programs.

Erie employees have welcomed the Fellows with open arms. Though these eight Fellows are fully licensed and credentialed, we were nervous that there would be a misconception to treat them as students. However this has not been the case. Our preceptors have been so excited to work with these young professionals. We have grown in the number of interested preceptors and in the number of Erie staff members who support what we are doing.

Four Erie sites serve as the Home Sites of our Fellows: Erie Helping Hands, Erie Foster Avenue, Erie West Town and Erie Division Street. These home sites are where our Fellows see their own patients with the support of a preceptor two days a week. The rest of their week is made up of one day of Mentored Clinic and one day of a Specialty Clinic. In both of these Clinic Settings, the Fellow is seeing patients off their preceptor's schedule.

With the COVID-19 pandemic, scheduling Specialty Clinics has been challenging. However we have been able to be creative and establish relevant Specialty Clinic rotations such as COVID-19 Results, where Fellows will call high-risk patients with their COVID-19 test results, reassess their symptoms and ensure they have everything they need to isolate at home. Another Specialty rotation that has opened up to the Fellows is Telehealth. Though Telehealth was a piece of our original curriculum, we could have never imagined the critical need for this service.
